Course Credits

Course credits are primarily determined by the number of class periods per week. English, history, math, science and foreign language courses are typically 5 credits per semester. The majority of the required courses are offered daily as a year long course. Course credits vary from 1-5 credits per semester (2-10 per years.) Dual-Credit College courses are available to juniors and seniors. Test Prep, Senior Seminar, and aides receive only Pass/Fail evaluation and are not included in a student's GPA.
